I documented the evolution of the project, which is part of a five-year, \$12 million national program funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.

coordinating, and conducting 14 focus groups and 25 interviews of individuals who have disabilities in the San Francisco Bay Area in an effort to improve survey questions. I recorded transcripts and coded data using qualitative research methods. I also conducted cognitive testing interviews to pre-test survey questions.
